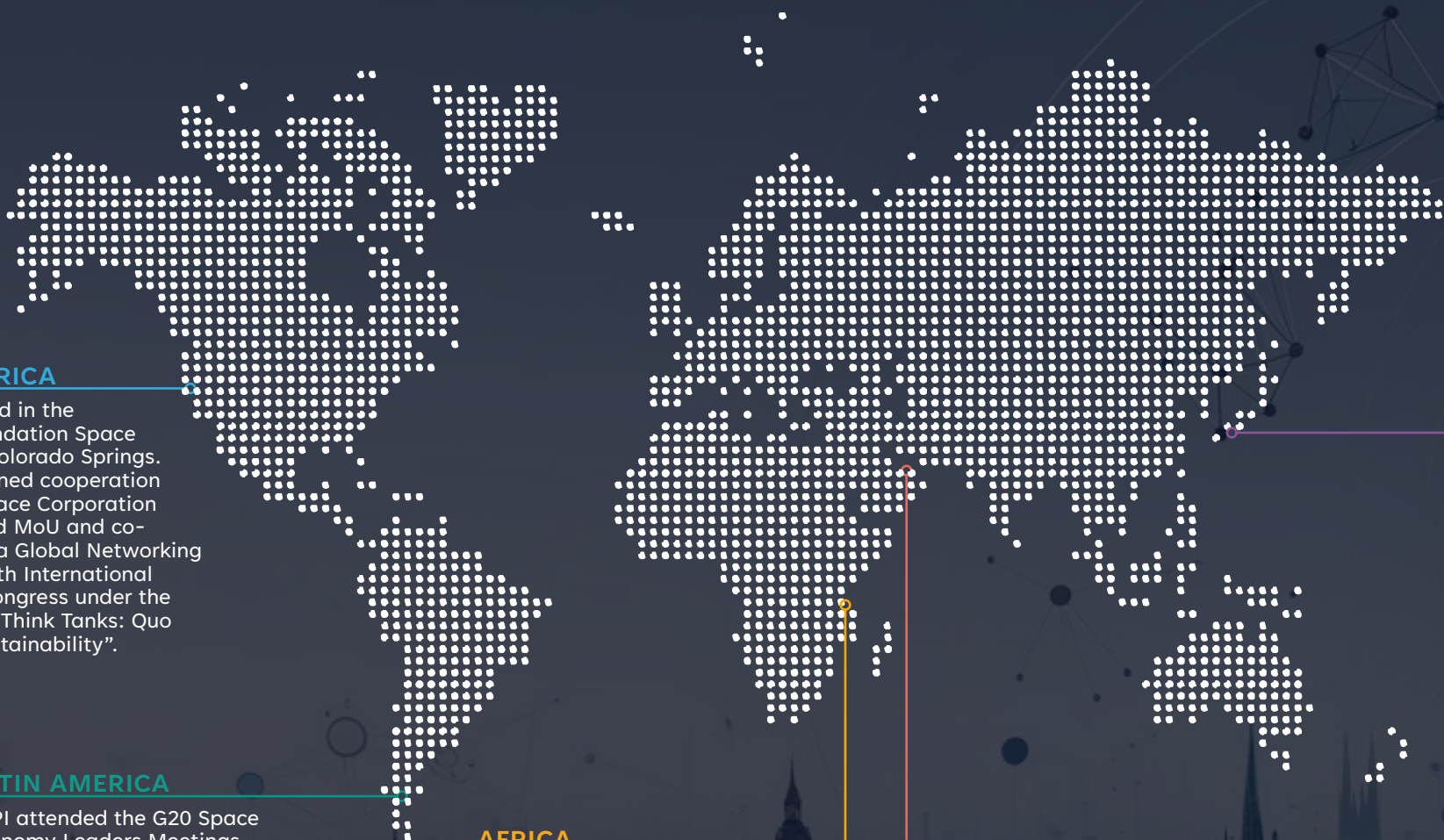




# GLOBAL IMPACT



## NORTH AMERICA

ESPI participated in the 39th Space Foundation Space Symposium in Colorado Springs. ESPI also deepened cooperation with the Aerospace Corporation with a dedicated MoU and co-organisation of a Global Networking Forum at the 75th International Astronautical Congress under the topic “Heads of Think Tanks: Quo Vadis Space Sustainability”.

## LATIN AMERICA

ESPI attended the G20 Space Economy Leaders Meetings in Brazil, and hosted the Inaugural Inter-Regional Space Policy Dialogue between the Latin America and Caribbean Group (GRULAC) and Europe alongside the UN COPUOS Legal Subcommittee and with support of the Argentinian Permanent Mission in Vienna.

## AFRICA

ESPI attended the NewSpace Africa Conference in Luanda and participated in the first African Space Leadership Institute (ASLI) colloquium series on the African Outer Space Programme. ESPI also participated in TeanGeo 2024 and the New Space Horizons Conference in Tunis and Cairo, respectively. For the first time, the African perspective was also included in our annual “Space Venture” report series, thanks to a partnership with Space in Africa.

## ASIA-PACIFIC

ESPI joined the 30th Annual Meeting of the Asia-Pacific Regional Space Agency Forum (APRSAF), as well as hosted the 4th Inter-Regional Space Policy Dialogue between Europe and Asia-Pacific. In Japan, ESPI attended SPACETIDE 2024 and the 6th Summit for Space Sustainability. Additionally, with Korea Aerospace Research Institute (KARI) we co-hosted a Workshop on Europe-ROK cooperation in STM and ESPI developed a new MoU with Korean Academy of Space Security (KASS). In Australia, ESPI delivered a keynote presentation at the 2nd Australian Space Cyber Forum and welcomed three master’s students as part of its joint Traineeship Programme with Flinders University.

## MIDDLE EAST

ESPI continued its presence at main events in the Middle East region, joining both the Abu Dhabi Space Debate 2024 and the LEAP 2024 conference.
